

DFW Airport has seven runways and can accommodate simultaneously a combination of four takeoffs and landings.



- 24-hour Operations
- No Slot Constraints
- No Curfews
- 7 Runways
- 5 Terminals
- Any aircraft at maximum payload can land at DFW





Jointly owned by the cities of Dallas and Fort Worth, DFW has built a huge infrastructure and still has room to grow.





DFW is served by 19 passenger carriers and 13 cargo carriers.











































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









DFW currently has nonstop service to 44 international destinations.





DFW currently has nonstop service to 144 domestic destinations.






DFW's international cargo network serves 14 major cargo hubs around the world.



DFW Total Passengers (Millions)





A very strong local originating market allowed DFW to outperform most of its domestic competitors during the recession.








Typically, the success of an airport's air service development efforts will be directly related to the following market and carrier variables

- Geography






DFW currently has non stop service to 19 of its top 25 largest international markets.






An alliance hub to hub operation such as the DFW-London-Heathrow service builds over 28,000 individual alliance connections for AA and BA





The new route served by Qantas offers passengers 139 connections beyond DFW and 105 connections beyond Sydney and Brisbane.





Carriers considering long-haul service may need to invest over half a billion dollars in a market before they operate their first flight.




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
Air Service Development Opportunities & Challenges

One technological advancement that will help DFW to reach new markets in the future is the 787 aircraft.





The range of the 787 aircraft allows an airline to fly nonstop from DFW to markets in Australia and China.








The Terminal Renewal and Improvement Program (TRIP) will begin February 2011 in Terminal A.





Updates include re-configured ticket counters to enhance self-service..





Security checkpoints will be reconfigured and expanded to improve operational efficiency.






Similar to Terminal D, all terminals' shops and restaurants will be grouped at key passenger circulation points, rather than spread throughout the terminals.
